BRYAN-EVANS RETIRED EDUCATORS ASSOCIATION BYLAWS



ARTICLE I. NAME

The name of this Association shall be the Bryan-Evans Retired Educators Association, hereafter referred to as "The Bryan-Evans Retired Educators Association."

ARTICLE 11. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Association shall be:

- A. To cooperate with the Georgia Retired Educators Association;
- B. To cooperate with the NREA Division of the American Association of Retired persons by promoting membership, legislation, national projects and programs;
- C. To maintain and improve the social, educational, economic and recreational welfare and status of retired educators in the local community;
- D. To help retired educators maintain identity with the teaching profession and to further the cause of education, and to provide opportunities for meaningful contact with friends and associates of the active teaching years;
- E. To gather and disseminate information of value to members legislative, OREA update information, etc.;
- F. To provide an organizational framework through which retired educators can continue a life of service to fellow members; their colleagues and the community;
- G. To respond to community needs and to encourage retired educators to contribute their talents and experience to the decision-making processes in their local communities;
- H. To present the image of aging as one of dignity, independence and purpose;
- I. To encourage active educators to prepare for retirement and to familiarize retired and active educators with the benefits of membership in the local, state and national associations; J. To encourage paraprofessionals to enter the teaching profession and offer support through providing a local scholarship.

ARTICLE III. GOVERNANCE

The Bryan-Evans REA shall be governed by its own officially adopted bylaws. These bylaws shall in no way conflict with the Constitution and Bylaws of the Georgia REA or the Bylaws of the American Association of Retired Persons.

ARTICLE IV. AFFILIATION

The Bryan-Evans REA shall be affiliated with the Georgia REA and with the American Association of Retired Persons.

ARTICLE V. MEMBERSHIP

Section 1.

Active. Membership shall be open to any retired employee or former educator or administrator, who has been employed in any educational institution or in the field of education.

Section 2.

Associate. Associate membership shall be open to any active teacher or other person interested in the work of this Association and approved for membership by the Executive Committee. An associate member shall have membership rights and privileges; except the right to vote, hold office or to represent the Association.

Section 3.

Life. Life membership shall be open to any member eligible for active or associate membership.

ARTICLE VI. FINANCE

Section 1.

Fiscal Year. The fiscal year of the Bryan-Evans unit shall correspond with that of the Georgia REA and shall begin on May 1 of each year.

Section 2.

Dues. The annual dues of active and associate members shall be:

- 1. Local dues; \$10.00 per year.
- 2. State dues; \$24.00 per year.

ADD Plan - Monthly - \$2.00

Life Membership - \$360.00

LADD Monthly -\$1.50

- 3. Continuing members. Dues of all continuing members are payable within a three-month period of the beginning of the fiscal year.
- 4. New Members. Dues of new members received by the treasurer within three months of the end of the unit fiscal year shall be credited to the following fiscal year.
- 5. Emeritus Status. When a member reaches the age of (90) free membership is provided at the local and state level

Section 3

Finances. The unit shall provide for such audit and control of its finances as are necessary for their complete accounting and safe keeping.

ARTICLE VII. OFFICERS

Officers. The elected officers of the Association shall be a President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer and President-Elect

Duties

- a. President. The President shall:
 - 1. Preside at all general meetings and at meetings of the Executive Committee.
 - 2. Appoint, with the approval of the Executive Committee, chairmen of standing special committees.
 - 3. Service as ex-officio member of all committees except the nominating committee.
- b. Vice-President. There shall be a Vice-President of the unit to work with the President and substitute for him or her when necessary. The Vice-President shall perform such duties as are assigned by the President or Executive Committee.
- c. Secretary. The Secretary shall:
 - 1. Record and keep a permanent file of the minutes of all general meetings and of the Executive Committee.
 - 2. Have available for reference at all meetings a copy of the unit bylaws, a list of officers and committees.
 - 3. Have charge of such correspondence as delegated by the President.
 - 4. Keep on file all incoming communications and copies of all outgoing correspondence.
 - 5. Make sure that copies of relevant correspondence and other materials are sent to the appropriate state REA offices and AARP officers and staff.
 - 6. Forward to the state REA and to the AARP area office all appropriate information, including names and addresses of new officers and committee chairmen.

d Treasurer. The Treasurer shall:

- 1. Be responsible for collecting and recording the receipt of dues,
- 2. Be responsible for recording any other monies.
- 3. Be responsible for paying all bills provided for in the budget or confirmed by the President.
- 4. Be responsible for keeping a proper set of books, .
- 5. Be responsible for rendering a financial report at the annual meeting and at such other times as is requested by the President.
- 6. Serve on the Budget Committee,
- 7. Present the unit's books for an annual audit by the President and officers of Bryan-Evans REA.
- 8. Forward members dues to the state REA treasurer when necessary.

ARTICLE VIII. EXCECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

Section 1.

Membership. The Executive Committee shall be composed of the elected officers.

Section 2,

Duties. The Executive Committee shall.

- a. Have emergency power to act on behalf of the total membership if the need should arise.
- b. Perform such duties as may from time to time be expedient.
- a Preside for such audit and control of funds as are necessary to assure their safe-keeping and complete accounting.

Section 3.

Meetings. Meetings of the Executive Committee shall be called at the request of the President.

Section 4.

Quorum. A majority (half) of the membership of the Executive Committee shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE IX ELECTIONS AND TERMS OF OFFICE

Section 1

Nominations. A Nominating Committee of at least 4 members, shall prepare a slate of nominees to be presented at the March meeting. Nominations can be made from the floor provided prior consent of the nominee has been obtained

Section 2.

Elections. Elections shall be held at the March meeting. A majority of the votes cast shall be necessary for election. In cases where there is but one nominee for office, a voice vote can be taken.

Section 3.

Terms of office. All officers shall be sworn in and take office at the May meeting. Section 4.

Vacancies. All vacancies in office shall be filled for the unexpired term by the Executive Committee and the President with the approval of the membership.

ARTICLE X COMMITTEES

Section 1. Committees

- a. Stand Committees. There shall be unit standing committees as follows:
 - Membership
 - Public Relations
 - Nominations
 - Legislative
 - Community Service Awards
 - Sunshine

- Educational Gift
- Telephone
- Necrology
- Pre-Retirement
- Scrapbook
- Program-Yearbook
- History

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b. Additional Committees. There shall be additional standing and special committees as shall be considered necessary to carry on the work of the unit.

Section 2.

Duties of Chairmen

Chairmen of committees shall:

- a. Establish a regular meeting schedule to carry out responsibilities of the committee.
- b. Develop committee activity reports for the REA unit President, Executive Committee and membership.
- c. Motivate members to carry out their responsibilities; involve all committee members.

ARTICLE XI. MEETINGS AND QUORUM

Section 1. Meetings.

- a. Regular Meetings. Regular meetings of the unit shall be held for seven times during the year. They shall be held the second Tuesday of the months design
- b. Special Meetings. Special meetings may be called by the President, by the executive committee, or by written request of a majority of members.
- c. Annual Meeting. The annual meeting shall be held during the month of May and shall be for the purpose of reporting on the convention, installation of officers, receiving annual reports of officers and committees and for such other business as may properly arise.

Section 2.

Quorum. Half of the active participating membership of the unit shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE XII RULES OF ORDER PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

The rules contained in Robert's Rules of Order, Revised, shall govern this unit in all cases in which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these bylaws.
